ORDER DISMISSING PETITION

By Petition dated June 4, 2021, with the Hawai'i County Board of Ethics (hereinafter "the Board"), Petitioner Dwight Vicente (hereinafter referred to as "Petitioner") requested that the County of Hawai'i cease and desist any and all acts to Usurp Jurisdiction over Crown and Government lands.

At its duly noticed meeting of August 11, 2021, the Board initially reviewed and considered the above-captioned Petition pursuant to Rule 4 of the *Rules of Practice and Procedure of the Board of Ethics*. Petitioner appeared in person and provided his testimony to the Board. The Board also received and reviewed evidence submitted by the Petitioner.

Board Chair David Wiseman moved to dismiss the petition for lack of jurisdiction and Board member Amy Self seconded the motion. The Board, having examined and weighed the record and files in this case and the evidence submitted by the Petitioner, and having considered the relevant information presented as well as the Hawai'i County Charter, the Hawai'i County Code, and the Board's Rules of Practice and Procedure, unanimously approved the motion to dismiss Petition 2021-07 by a vote of 5-0.

ORDER

Based upon the foregoing, the Hawai'i County Board of Ethics orders that Petition No. 2021-07 is hereby dismissed.

Pursuant to Board Rule 4.9, the Order Dismissing the Petition shall be filed and a copy shall be sent to the Petitioner.
