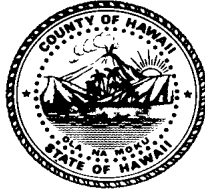

OLD BUSINESS

1. BOA-21-000299 – COMPREHENSIVE REVIEW OF BOA RULES OF PRACTICE AND PROCEDURES AND PROPOSED AMENDMENTS

The Board of Appeals passed a motion to initiate rule amendment proceedings at its hearing on April 9, 2021, in accordance with Hawai'i County Board of Appeals Rules of Practice and Procedure, Rule 5 Rulemaking Procedures. The proposed amendments include a comprehensive review and update to provide more consistency and adherence to related statutes and codes. Further in accordance with Hawai'i Revised Statutes 92-2.5, the Board created a Permitted Interaction Group at its May 12, 2023, hearing to review the rules and make recommendations to the Board. The Permitted Interaction Group provided a summary report of

its findings at the September 14, 2023, hearing. The Board reviewed and discussed the draft rule amendments at its October 13, 2023, hearing. The Board will review and deliberate the draft rule amendments for adoption.

EXECUTIVE SESSION
